From Light into Lent

After a more lengthy Epiphany Season this year, our recent Ash Wednesday services mark the beginning of our Lenten Season.

The Epiphany Season is well positioned before the Season of Lent. In a sense, the Epiphany Season builds us up with a strong foundation of hope, confidence and assurance so that it may strengthen our resolve and fortify us for the challenges and preparations of a truly disciplined and meaningful Lenten journey. The Light found in the Epiphany can illumine our pathways into the "wilderness" experiences of our Lenten journey ahead that will lead us to Easter.

Since the Beginning of the Fourth Century, Christians have journeyed through a Lenten Season to ultimately prepare themselves for Holy Week and Easter. Traditionally, the 40 days of Lent have been a time of special observances in worship, prayers, spiritual formation, self-evaluation, spiritual disciplines, self-denial, fasting, meditation and reflection. It is also a time of repentance and renewal. All of these observances, practices and experiences are to prepare ourselves for the true meaning and celebration of Easter. Easter remains the single most significant event in Christianity and in the Church. Christ's suffering, death and resurrection is the theological core of Christianity.

In our Adult Education class, we have been studying Adam Hamilton's book, *The Walk*, in which he suggests five principles to be practiced during the Lenten Season (and all year around!):

- 1. Worship and Prayer—To frequently worship (especially with praise!) and to frequently pray (especially with a grateful heart!)
- 2. Study—To study and listen to God (especially from the Scriptures!)
- 3. Serve—To intentionally serve the needs of others (especially showing acts of kindness!).
- 4. Give—To generously and purposefully give of ourselves (especially financially!)
- 5. Sharing—To share our faith and the love of God with others (especially looking for opportunities to be a witness in our daily lives!)

If you have not attended our recent Adult Education class, I highly recommend this informative and inspirational book and practices to prepare for a transformational Lenten experience.

Once again, I invite you to a faithful, meaningful, and transformational observance of a Holy Lent. May the Light and the riches from the Epiphany Season guide you in your Lenten journey.




The Women of the Church will be studying Conversation Peace by Mary A. Kassian. The sub title for this study is "The Power of Transformed Speech."

This is a Biblical guide to lead us into ways of communicating our likes and dislikes, even our


