Now in the true meaning of this particular season, this is a challenging season indeed! It is not for the timid or fainthearted! I think it is particularly challenging to live our faith during the many activities and distractions of the summer and beginning fall months. We must be intentional in our faithful living during the more relaxed, sometimes complacent time of summer and also during the many activities and distractions of the fall season. May God grant us the strength, wisdom and serenity to be faithful disciples and witnesses of our faith to a watching world — in our ordinary lives. May the power of Pentecost and the Holy Spirit be with us!


